How important was whaling in Hudson
3-4 ships -

Battle of ^{Saratoga}
1777 -
10/6/1777

Quakers { 1200 sailors from New York killed/imprisoned by
British during Rev. War
large group New Yorkers moved to Nova Scotia

Cleveland Landing was a shipping stop for tea & other goods
down to NYC

pre-fab houses built in New York & Providence
in spring 1838 to Hudson South Bay
burned in 1838

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The Proprietors &
Their Lasting Influence
to Hudson

Grid was designed before they came

1784 25 X 120 = lots

1785 - all
proprietors here street widths the same
including the alleys

planned city

NYC - grid adopted 1811

Savannah GA grid laid out 1733
including parks

The original proprietors stayed as a group
and met regularly - kept

1st chartered City in US
3rd " " in NY state

1790 South side of city below 4th st completed

Promenade Hill - set aside from the beginning
7th St. Park was in 1810 plans

Tell on 4th street

local Dutch didn't like Quakers

Dutch was local language Freeborn

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27 Quaker families 1785

2,500 by 1810

~~1810~~  roving, steam power - sailors, workers

1810 Proprietors dissolved

shipping business died away by 1820 or so.

mfg - Rope Alley - rope

shale oil processing 1st & 2nd of Columbia

Rum trade - distillery

Evans Brewery - North Bay 1786

built water & sewer infrastructure to support sales of lots 1788

hollowed out logs - sewer in lower Hudson as late as 1750

Hudson City cemetery - set up by Proprietors
Northeast section near Ten Broeck Rd
Proprietors buried there.

1786 Proprietors got NY Legislature to carve
Columbia City off New Albany City

Hudson became county seat ~ 1810

John Brooke - Columbia Rising
History of politics in Hudson
~ 1790 - 1840's

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1830's Rent Wars

RR built in 1850 - end of shipping

Ho Eran Iron Works ~ 1850's
wood stores

civil war

near present Calveruso wharf

Split of Ho Eran
→ Greenport & Stockport - taxes
1837 1833
died Willard

Mt. Marisco originally part of Hudson but
not owned by Proprietors
